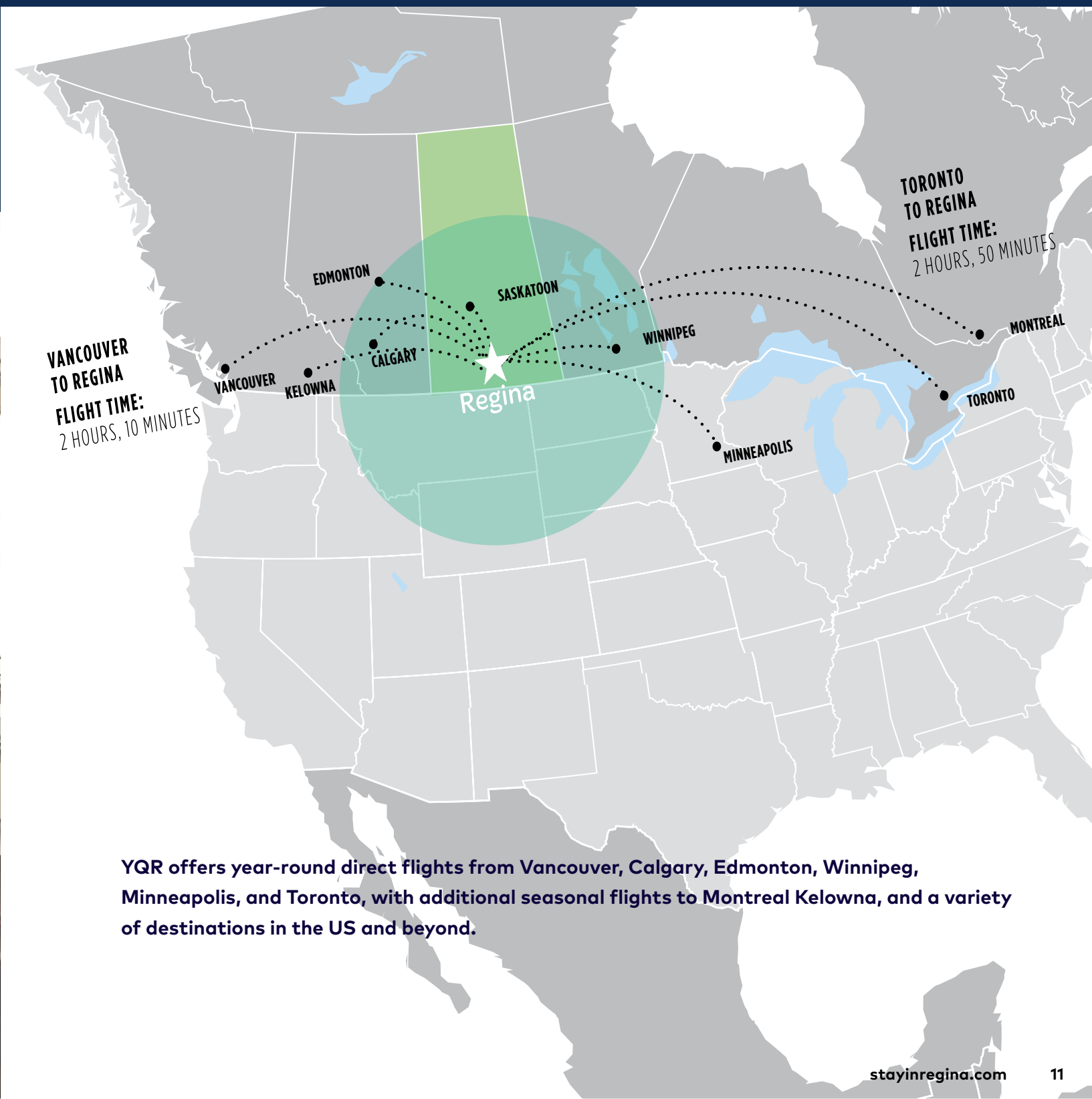
YQR – Regina International Airport – is only 10 minutes to downtown and only moments away from a wide variety of event facilities. That means less time commuting and more time to play the game.

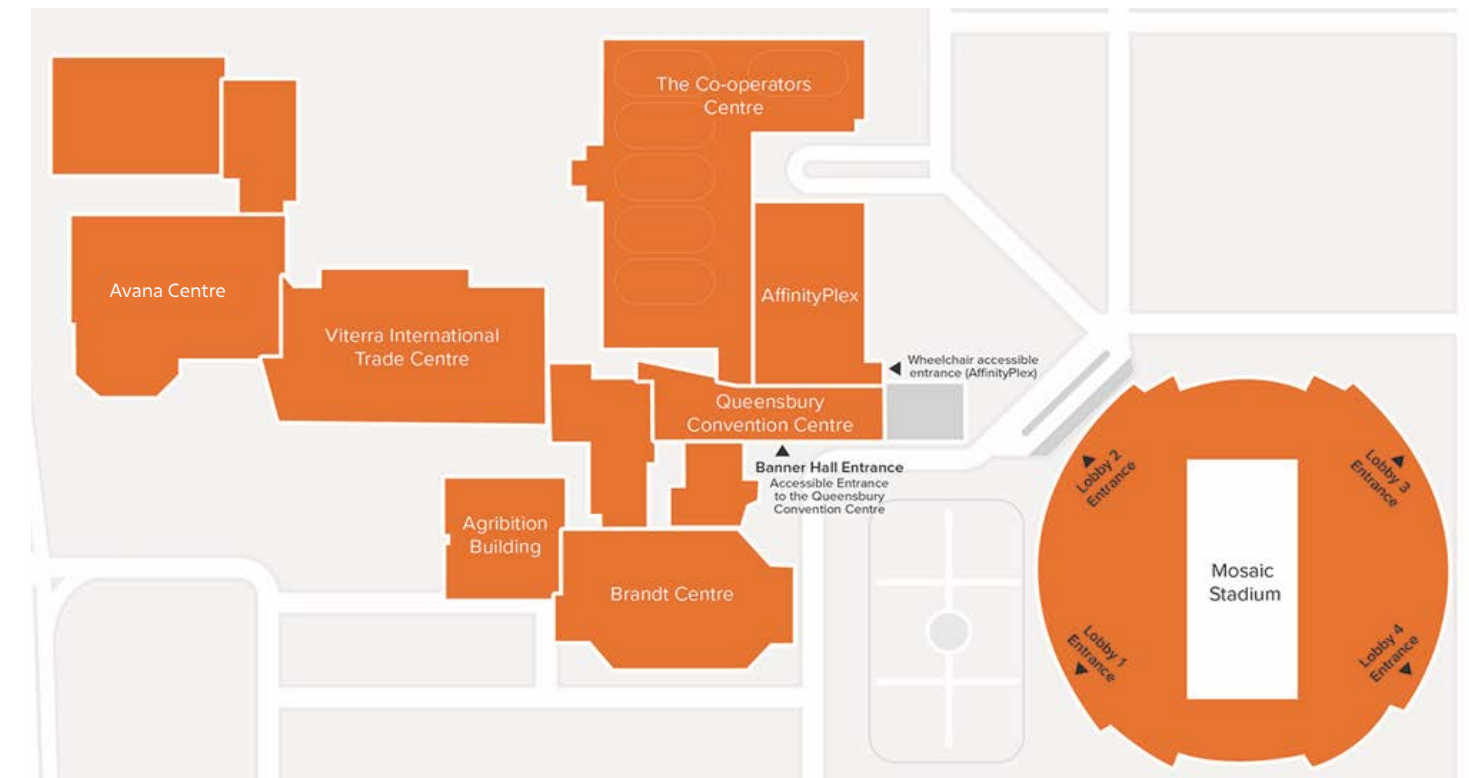
Spanning over 100 acres, the district combines state-of-the-art infrastructure with diverse recreational options, catering to both local and international audiences.

AFFINITYPLEX

The 90,000 sq. ft. AffinityPlex is Regina's premier multi-purpose facility that's home to more than 300 events and 1.3M visitors each year. It provides flexible space for trade shows, conventions and recreational programs of all shapes and sizes. This multi-purpose building has 35 ft. high ceilings, interchangeable artificial turf, and 16 dressing rooms. It has a capacity for 7,000 people and bleacher seating for 1,500 spectators.

THE CO-OPERATORS CENTRE

Home to Canada's newest six ice-pad arena complex hosting year-round sports, recreation and special event programming –all under one roof! The Co-operators Centre main arena has seating capacity for 1,300 and press boxes with room for working media. The Co-operators Centre also offers free public skating, drop-in hockey and figure skating. Your favourite food and beverage stations on-site make every moment an enjoyable one at the Co-operators Centre.

VITERRA INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTRE (VITC)

The VITC is a 150,000 sq. ft. multi-purpose facility that joins all buildings on the 100-acre property, with the exception of Mosaic Stadium. It is the perfect location for trade and consumer shows, large meetings, catered events and everything in between. The VITC has three multi-purpose spaces with multiple overhead doors for ease of movement. Two of the spaces are 21,732 sq. ft. and a third larger space is 43,615 sq. ft. The one-story building also has a 7,785 sq. ft. mezzanine area that overlooks the multipurpose spaces.

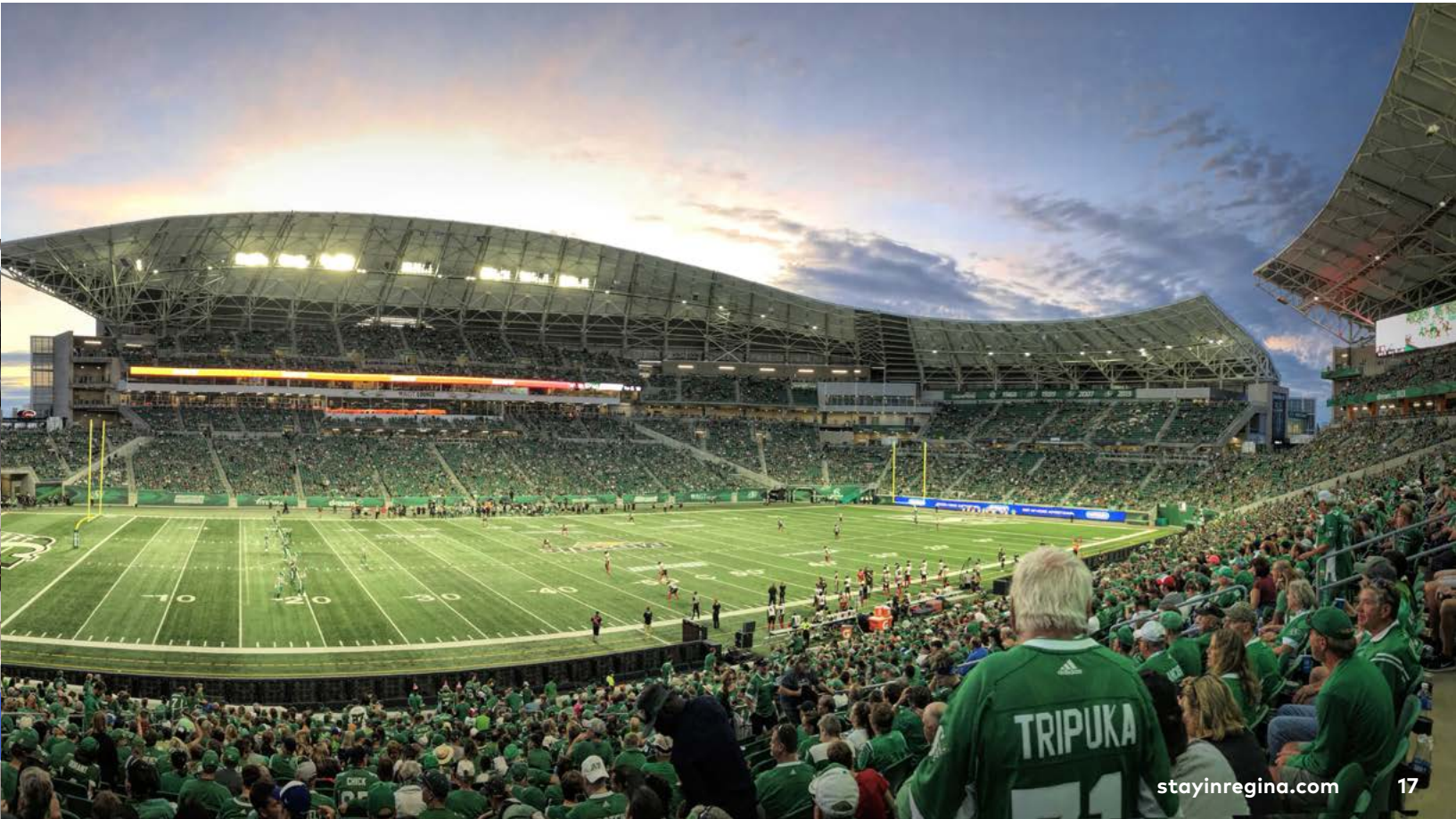
MOSAIC STADIUM

The most well-known and storied sport venue in town is Mosaic Stadium, home to the beloved Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League (CFL). The stadium has a standard seating capacity of 33,000 and can be expanded to 40,000. The stadium delivers an incredible event experience with wider individual seats, a sunken bowl to ease spectator access, expansive concourses, and a wide range of concessions and hospitality offerings, including a general admission lounge and premium options that include 38 suites for corporate partners. Mosaic Stadium is much more than a sporting facility. This centerpiece of the Regina horizon offers several premium service lounges and suites for hosting corporate meetings, receptions, luncheons and galas. These modern spaces can accommodate a range of event types in a unique and comfortable setting. You can enjoy premium culinary services in stunning lounge and reception spaces that boast exceptional views of the CFL's premier football stadium.

BRANDT CENTRE

The Brandt Centre is a 6,000 seat facility that has played host to the biggest musical names in show business, doubling as a concert hall, and a venue for championship curling, figure skating, basketball, rodeos, and other sporting and agricultural showcases. The Brandt Centre is home to the WHL Regina Pats and has played host to several events, including Skate Canada International, MasterCard Memorial Cup, Tim Hortons Brier, Canadian Western Agribition and numerous concerts.

AVANA CENTRE

The Avana Centre is a 120,000 square foot multi-purpose indoor arena that caters to various sports, including skateboarding, pickleball, volleyball, and basketball. Its adaptable space makes it suitable for both recreational and competitive events. The centre is designed to accommodate different configurations, ensuring that each sport receives the necessary facilities to meet its specific requirements. The Avana Centre is home to:

Volleybarn - Two (2) volleyball courts

Queen City Pickleball Hub -Sixteen (16) pickleball courts

Regina Skateboarding Coalition - As Regina's largest indoor skatepark, this inclusive facility supports the physical, pyschological and social wellbeing of Regina youth through skateboarding and skateboard culture.

The Dugout Performance Centre - The Dugout features brand-new 70' lanes equipped with cutting-edge technology for an unparalleled baseball training experience

WASCANA CENTRE

Wascana Centre, located in the heart of Regina, Saskatchewan, is a picturesque and multifaceted area that combines natural beauty with state-of-the-art sports facilities. Spanning over 2,300 acres, this urban parkland is a hub for both recreational and competitive sports, enhanced by its proximity to the University of Regina. The centre's diverse amenities make it an ideal venue for hosting a wide range of sporting events.



FINISHING LINE FACILITY AT WASCANA LAKE

The Pine Island Finishing Line Facility was constructed in 2014 and provides a fully enclosed judging platform for local, provincial, national and international competitions hosted on Wascana Lake. There is also room for 700 spectators on the island, which is accessible by a bridge. The design of the race course allows for several options regarding lane spacing and markings. Athletes and coaches from across Canada consistently express their appreciation of Wascana Lake and consider it to be one of the best racing venues in the country. With the water depth at 5 metres deep, Wascana Lake also provides the advantage of being a still water lake that is well sheltered from winds. The venue provides access to an outstanding race course which is 1,000 metres in length.

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA

The Centre for Kinesiology, Health, and Sport is a state-of-the-art multi-use facility that draws local, national, and international events throughout the year. The Centre features a three-court gymnasium with seating for up to 2,000 spectators, 2 multipurpose gymnasiums, an elevated four-lane running track, dedicated combative room, movement studios, lecture and classroom facilities, teaching and research laboratories, an artificial turf field, 2 natural grass fields and a football centre for the U of R Rams Football Team. In addition, there is an expanded Allied Health Centre combining sport medicine, physiotherapy, student health, and the Dr. Paul Schwann Centre.

CANADA GAMES ATHLETIC COMPLEX AT DOUGLAS PARK

The Canada Games Athletic Complex includes venues for all track and field events, ample parking, crowd control, fencing, officials' room, administration centre, washrooms and shower rooms. The facility accommodates outdoor athletic activities for the University of Regina, Regina High School Athletic Association, Regina elementary school meets and local athletic clubs. Additional amenities include spectator seating for 2,100 people, sound system, washrooms and change rooms. Leibel Field is home to Regina Minor Football. The recently upgraded facility includes an artificial turf field, change rooms, meeting space, and seating for 1,500.

CITY FACILITIES

Regina has three major recreation centres which include three indoor pools as well as strength training areas, an indoor track, tennis courts and badminton courts. Regina also operates five outdoor pools, eight arenas, 15 spray pads, and hundreds of outdoor skating rinks, baseball diamonds, athletic fields, basketball courts, tennis courts, golf courses and more!



FIELDHOUSE AND LAWSON AQUATIC CENTRE

The multi-use Sportplex is perfect for hosting a range of events and houses the Fieldhouse, Lawson Aquatic Centre, Tracks Café and Sportco Sporting Goods. The Fieldhouse features a 200m impact absorbing oval track with six lanes, strength and conditioning area (wheelchair accessible), cycling area, basketball court, indoor tennis courts, badminton courts and 2 classrooms. Adjacent to the Fieldhouse is the Lawson Aquatic Centre, which includes a 65m pool with eight lanes, 1 and 3m diving boards, diving tower (5m, 7.5m & 10m), whirlpool (adult only), toddler pool, strength & conditioning area, men's and women's dry sauna, and a chair lift. The Lawson has hosted many national and international competitions for diving, speed and synchronized swimming, and water polo.

MOUNT PLEASANT SPORTS PARK

The Mount Pleasant Sport Park consists of two ball diamonds and two soccer fields. Currie Field, with seating for 1,000 spectators, is home of the Regina Red Sox. Beside Currie Field is Kaplan Field, which is regarded as one of the top men's softball diamonds in Saskatchewan. Kaplan Field has grand stand seating for 1,000 spectators. Concessions, washrooms and locker facilities are all available. Also on the foot print of Mount Pleasant are two full sized grass soccer pitches.

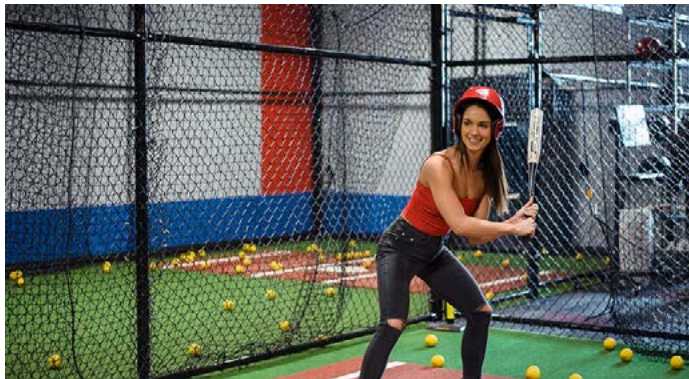

BALLER'S REC ROOM

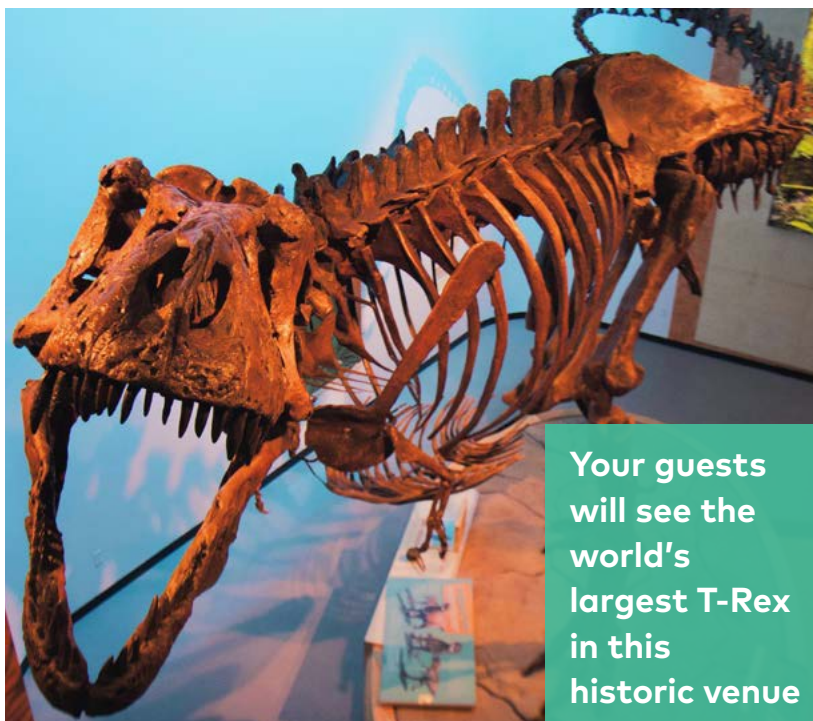

ROYAL SASKATCHEWAN MUSEUM

The Royal Saskatchewan Museum (RSM) is a Canadian natural history museum. Founded in 1906, it is the first museum in Saskatchewan, and the first provincial museum in the three Prairie Provinces.

The RSM has a theatre space for 300, a large lobby that can host receptions for up to 300 and a boardroom for 12. Host a fun networking reception that includes food stations, cocktails, and a scavenger hunt through the museum's galleries.

Application for hosting grant must be received up to minimum of 6 weeks before the date of the event. Funding up to \$10,000 is available for sanctioned amateur championship events at the provincial, Western Canadian, national or international level being held in Regina.
