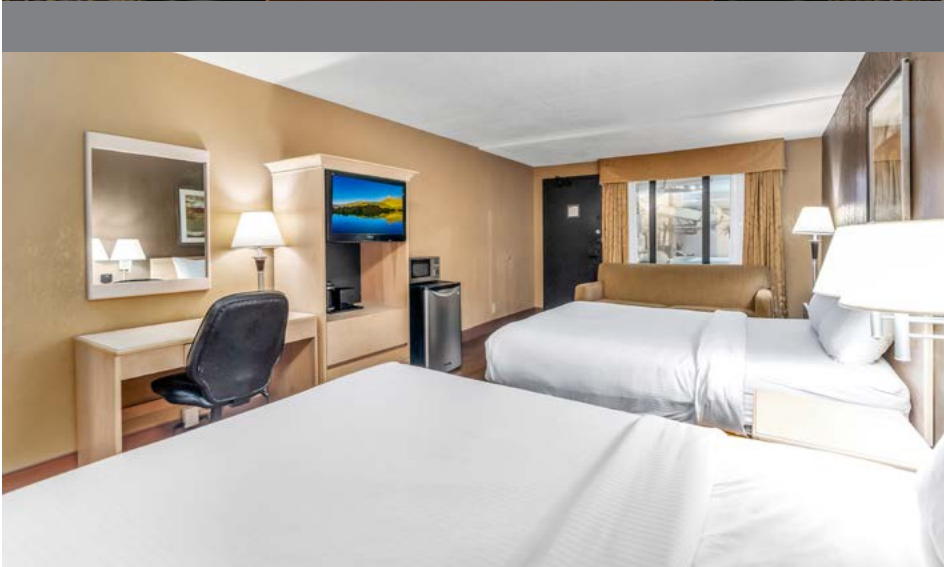

CONVENTION LEVEL

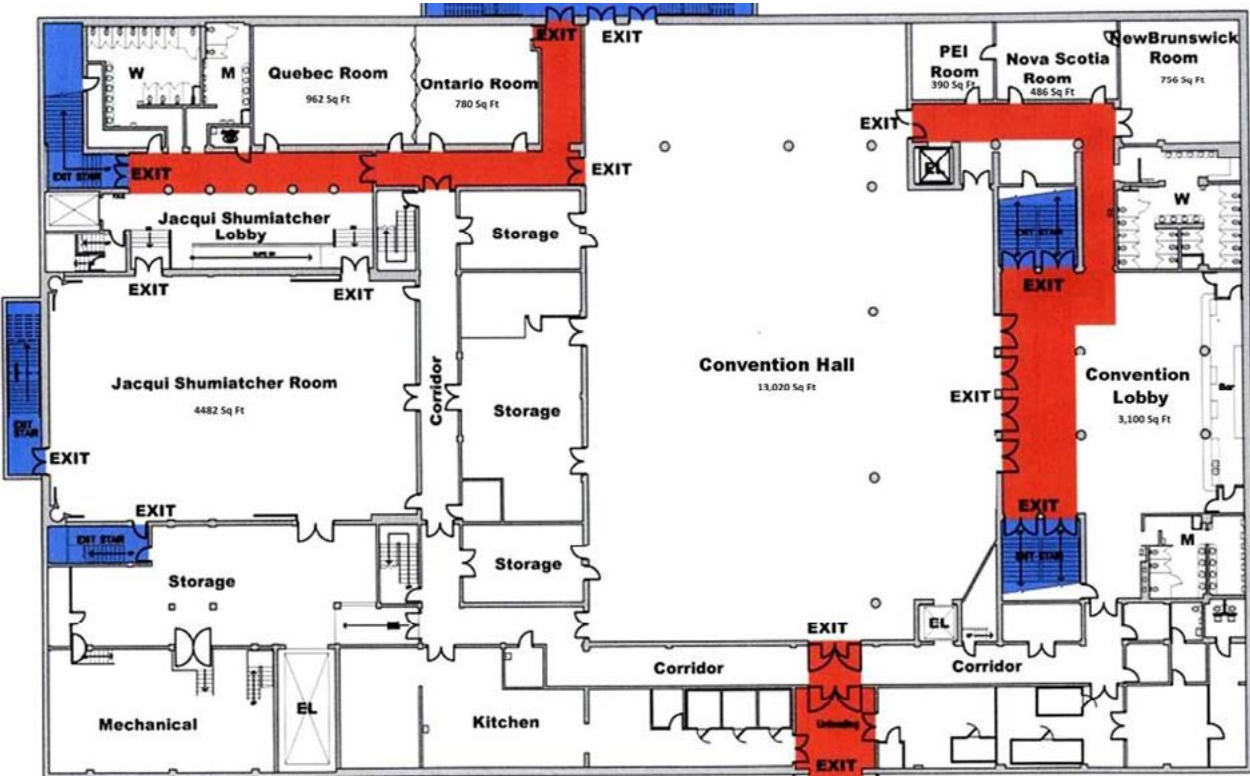
The convention level features 8 event spaces including the 13,020 square foot Convention Hall. It is a remarkably flexible space that can accommodate up to 1,400 people for a reception.

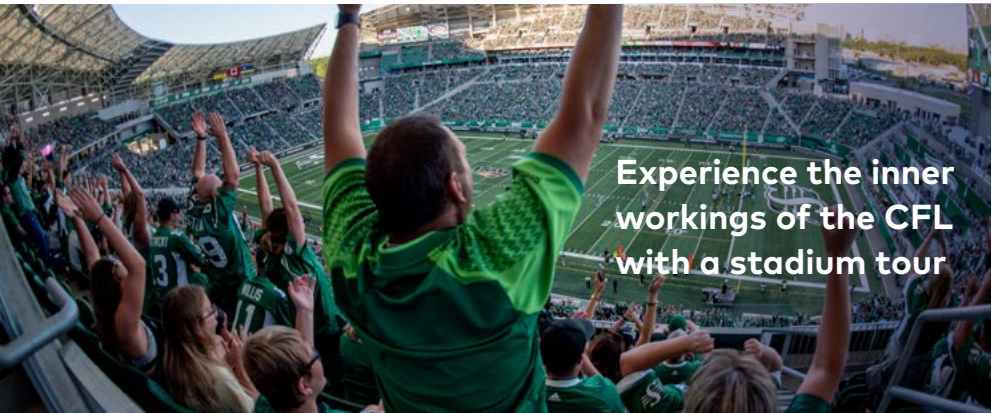


BUNGE INTERNATIONAL TRADE CENTRE (BITC)

Home to the Saskatchewan Roughriders Football Club, the stand-alone stadium has a variety of meeting & event experiences to offer your delegates.

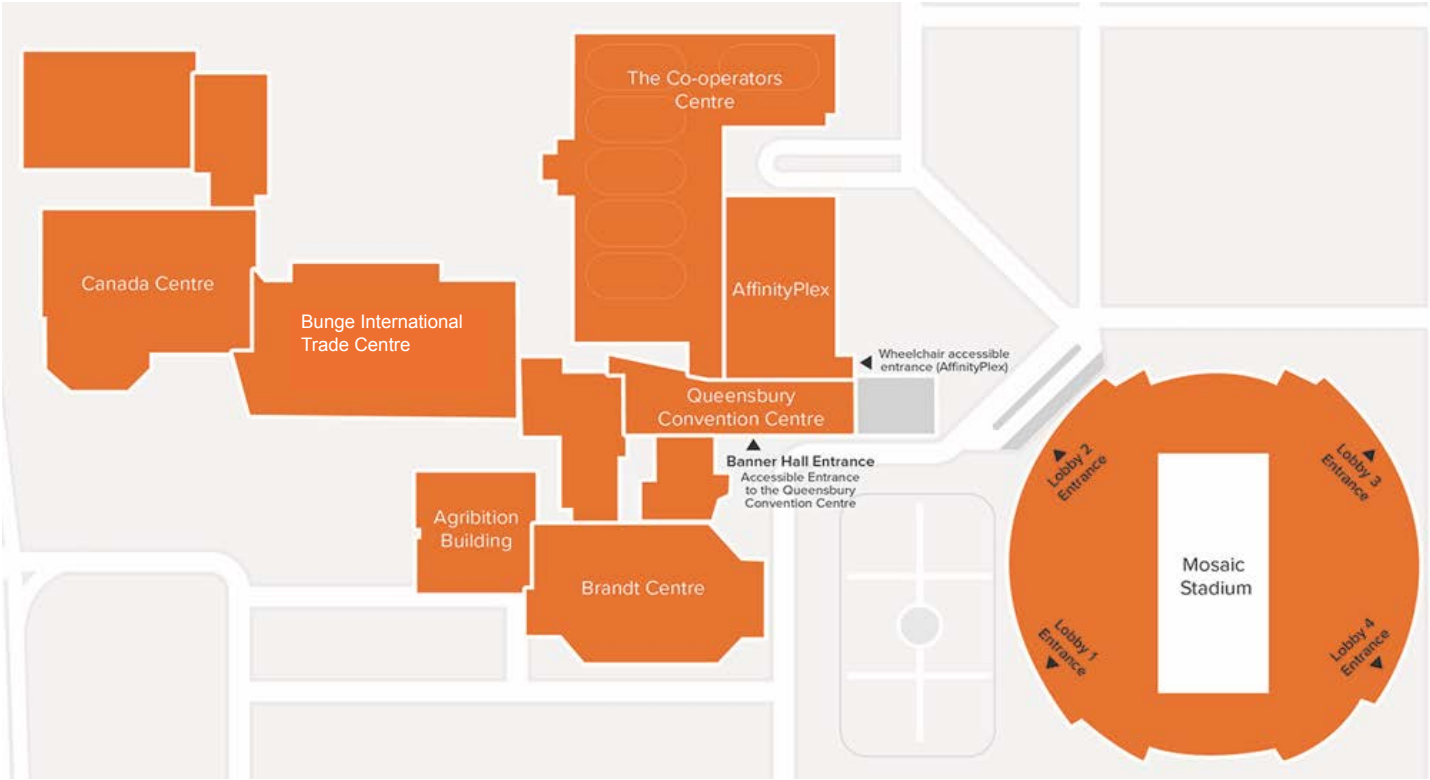

The FNUniv is the only First Nations owned post-secondary institution in Canada

FIRST NATIONS UNIVERSITY OF CANADA

First Nations University of Canada (FNUniv) is the home of the National Centre for Collaboration in Indigenous Education, connecting communities with each other to share their stories about Indigenous education across Canada and around the world.

Specializing in Indigenous knowledge, providing post-secondary education for Indigenous and non-Indigenous students alike, the FNUniv is a culturally supportive environment.

FNUniv offers several meeting spaces, from small to large boardrooms, to their large multipurpose room, and the beautiful First Nations Veterans Memorial Tipi (atrium).



RCMP HERITAGE CENTRE

An iconic piece of Canadian history, pride and tradition, The RCMP Heritage Centre is located on the RCMP Training Academy grounds.

The stunning glass and Tyndall stone building was designed by world-renowned architect Arthur Erickson. Whether you are considering a business meeting, gala reception, or a private event, the venue offers a variety of unique spaces, including a 124-seat theatre space, the Regimental Lobby, and a modern conference room that can accommodate up to 250 guests.

Soon to become Canada's newest national museum, there is no other venue like it in the country.

CASINO REGINA

For a Vegas-style entertainment experience, Casino Regina is home to the newly renovated Show Lounge. With three-tier seating on the main level, plus a balcony, this unique space can host up to 900 guests theatre style for a show, 412 for banquets, and 400 for receptions. Live entertainment with state-of-the-art sound and lighting can be arranged. The telegraph room located adjacent to the Show Lounge can accommodate up to 180 guests reception style or 100 seated for a banquet.

SASKATCHEWAN SCIENCE CENTRE

From informal gatherings to black-tie affairs, the Saskatchewan Science Centre is a spectacular venue in Regina.

The Kramer IMAX Theatre seats 145 guests theatre style. This space also includes the IMAX lobby featuring ample seating and room for cocktails, refreshments, or food.

The facility boasts eight unique spaces including: two theatres, two boardrooms, a 5,000 square foot hall, and the fabulous exhibit floor. Utilize the entire building to host up to 600 guests reception style as they explore all it has to offer.

MACKENZIE ART GALLERY

The MacKenzie Art Gallery is one of the most picturesque venues in the city, nestled in Wascana Park. They provide extraordinary event experiences in spaces that can accommodate groups of 20 - 400 delegates, including boardrooms, a theatre, and reception salon. Thoughtful on-site catering, all surrounded by the beauty of a world-class art museum, make it a seamless experience for off-site events.

DARKE HALL

Darke Hall is a 474-seat premier concert and performance venue focused on programming and promoting the work of local, national, and international artists. A major renovation was completed in 2021. Utilize the lobby space for a stand up reception.

INNOVATION PLACE

Innovation Place is a research and technology park where hundreds of networking events, workshops, hackathons and global conferences come together right next door to the University of Regina. This community supports emerging and established technology companies to connect with experienced mentors, investors and partners in the incubator-style workspaces.

ROYAL SASKATCHEWAN MUSEUM

The Royal Saskatchewan Museum (RSM) is a Canadian natural history museum. Founded in 1906, it is the first museum in Saskatchewan, and the first provincial museum in the three Prairie Provinces.

The RSM has a theatre space for 300, a large lobby that can host receptions for up to 300 and a boardroom for 12. Host a fun networking reception that includes food stations, cocktails, and a scavenger hunt through the museum's galleries.

ONLY IN REGINA

Regina's size and the proximity of event venues to a variety of experiences is a true competitive advantage that few other cities in North America can offer. Delegates will notice that there is more time to experience the city instead of spending it in transit.



REGINA-STYLE PIZZA

Did you know that Regina is well-known for its "Regina-style" pizza? Thick crust, slightly sweet tomato sauce, and piled high with layers of meat, veggies and LOTS of cheese cut into a defining square slice. It's famous for a reason.

Not only do people from across Canada routinely call to have pizza shipped to them in places like Vancouver, Toronto, Alaska and even Florida, it's a popular culinary treat among locals and visitors.



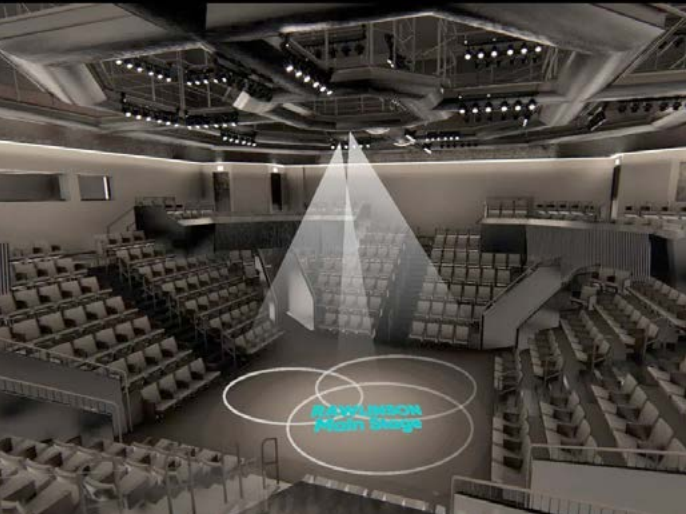
WASCANA CENTRE

Home to the Legislative Buildings, Art Gallery, Willow on Wascana, Wascana Pool, and a 15 minute walk from Regina's downtown. Spend some downtime in Regina's urban park that is larger than Central Park (New York) and Stanley Park (Vancouver) combined. Wascana Centre is a beautifully landscaped park surrounding a 150-hectare lake in the heart of Regina.



OVER THE HILL ORCHARD & WINERY

Regina's size means it's quick and easy to get out of town. A short drive northwest of the city presents an award-winning orchard and winery at Over the Hill Orchards. Host VIP guests at "Supper in the Orchard", a unique prairie dining experience. The orchard grows Dwarf Sour Cherries (Prairie Cherries™) which have been cultivated by the University of Saskatchewan for over 70 years. Enjoy them in a variety of local products, including wine of course!



REGINA GLOBE THEATRE

Regina's Globe Theatre is Canada's only permanent theatre in the round and welcomes more than 70,000 patrons each year. Featuring two stages, a 406 theatre in the round main stage, and a 100 seat black box space, the Globe is the province's largest performing arts organization. It is currently undergoing a \$30 million dollar renovation and will re-open in the fall of 2024.



GOVERNMENT HOUSE

Government House stands proudly as a National Historic Site and Provincial Heritage Property, boasting a rich collection of over 10,000 artifacts dating back to the late 1800s. Visitors can embark on both indoor and outdoor tours, delving into the captivating history, heritage, and ecological significance of Government House and its stunning Edwardian Gardens.

Explore North America's largest urban park, Wascana Centre, surrounded by just some of the more than 300,000 hand planted trees in Regina.

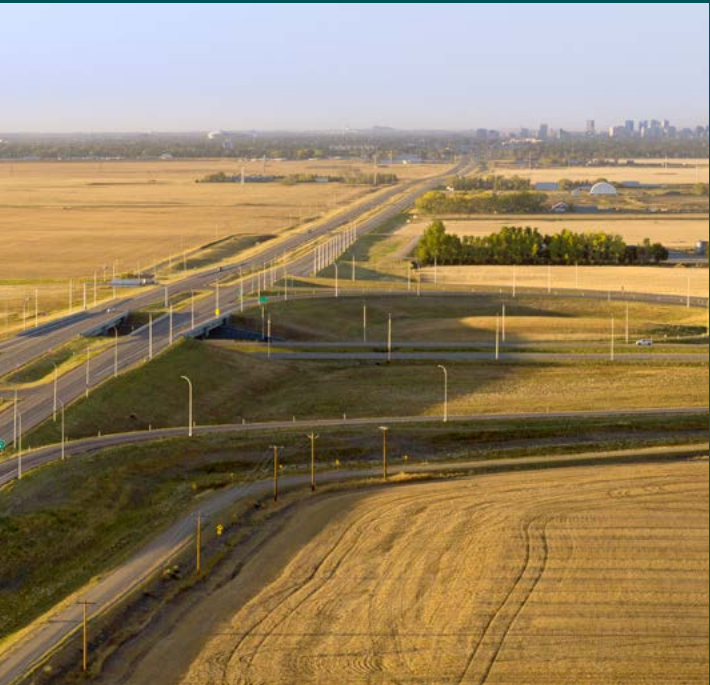
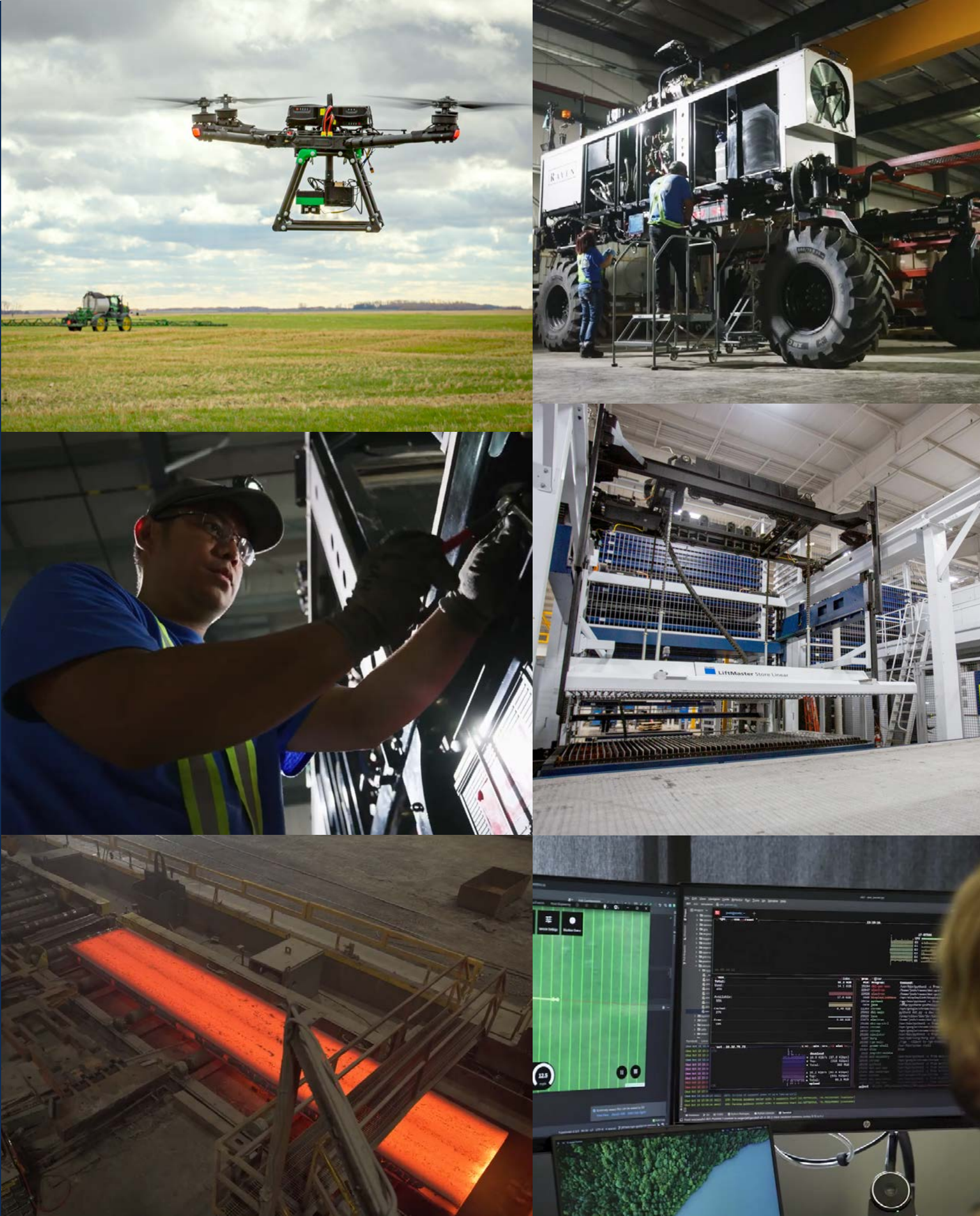
